## Why We Should Care

- Decisions by the professional botanist can determine the fate of species or one or more populations of a species
- Data gathered and "published" by the botanist can be valuable for a wide variety of floristic and conservation research
- Populations of native plants are rapidly being destroyed to accommodate development (agriculture, energy, housing)

#### **Problems**

- No accountability
  - No certification program
  - No formal code of ethics
  - No professional support for the ethical botanist
  - No means to censure an unethical botanist
- Lack of consistency
- Many rare plant populations and plant communities are destroyed without mitigation

## Problems (cont.)

- Lack of consistency
- Botany profession loses the trust of the public
- Lack of qualified professional botanists
- Lack of perceived need for a professional botanist
- Botanical resources not identified or protected

#### Code of Ethics

- A formal Code of Ethics is needed to:
  - Provide guidance
  - Provide accountability
  - Improve the standing of the profession
  - Improve the level of professionalism
  - Empower the botanist
- Best through a formal certification program

## Certification Program

- CNPS examining developing a certification program for California botanists
- Rigorous minimum qualifications
  - With flexibility
- Require following Code of Ethics
- Require continuing education
- Provide rewards and empowerment
- Provide discipline (even de-certification)
